“Jacolby Satterwhite: Room for Living” at the Fabric Workshop and Museum, Philadelphia

Following a two-year artist residency at the Fabric Workshop and Museum, Jacolby Satterwhite will present new digital animation works, a virtual reality experience, and multi-media installations that give physical form to objects that featured in his six-video piece *Reifying Desire*. Made using 3-D printers and CNC routers, Satterwhite’s sculptures will include larger-than-life figures inspired by *The Incredulity of Saint Thomas* by Caravaggio (1601–02) and Pablo Picasso’s *Les Femmes d’Alger (O. J. R. M.)* (1907). The artist also has an upcoming show at New York’s Pioneer Works, “You’re at Home” (October 4–November 24, 2019).
